
Students and parents, remember students should be adding 5% to their completion rate per week to be able to finish the course by the end of second semester.

Dear Families ...

You play a critical role in your student's success with i-Ready. Here are some ways you can support your student with their i-Ready Learning Path.

Share

- Share the experience with your student.
- Both of you can become familiar with the different parts of the student dashboard, and you can learn with your student as they complete a lesson
- i-Ready Dashboard



What is *i-Ready*?

Encourage

- Encourage your student to take each lesson and quiz question seriously.
- Emphasize "thinking before clicking," because just clicking through will not be a productive use of their time nor reflect what your student actually knows.
- Remind your student to read passages in their entirety, use paper and pencil to solve math problems, and use the tools that appear at the bottom of the screen in some lessons.

Track and Discuss Progress

- Regularly review progress with your student using the My Progress page.
- Please ask your student's teacher(s) for guidance on how many minutes they should spend on lessons each week.
- Our recommendation is that your student should aim for 45 minutes of i-Ready Personalized Instruction per subject per week while passing at least 2 lessons a week.


Our next meeting will take place on Thursday, February 23, 2023 at 5 pm on Zoom. Please pre-register on our website at lvs.leeschools.net.






TEACHERS! Reminder that you will need to logon to the district WiFi at least once per month to keep your laptop updated. Simply

On the Chromebook, most of the issues that students experience may simply be fixed by **CLEARING THE CACHE** or by restarting your device.

We recommend that you **UPDATE YOUR CHROMEBOOK** on a regular basis (especially if you notice the apps aren't loading or your computer is just acting unusual).



Some examples of issues with which we can help include:

- Password reset
- Chromebook not working as expected
- Chromebook screen or keyboard issues
- Chromebook connectivity not working as expected
- Student cannot access their Google Drive
- VSA/Educator: I cannot access my dashboard
