Parents can log into the FLVS platform in VSA to determine student progress. Students should be around 50% complete in all courses to be on track to finish by the end of December. If your student is not on track, please reach out to teachers to establish a plan to get back on pace. Our teachers are in constant contact with students regarding their progress and can provide expert guidance on next steps for your student.

As a reminder, all full-time Lee Virtual students are expected to remain on pace in their classes, attend weekly live lessons, and log into every class every school day to be counted as present. As a school, we analyze student progress and performance data weekly for every grade level and class. We stay focused on this data to determine students who need additional support to ensure every student is learning and growing.

Your partnership is vital to the success of your student. I encourage you to maintain an open line of communication with our dedicated teachers and staff. Together, students thrive!






What Do Good Readers Do?


Reading Strategy #1

METACOGNITION

Metacognition means to think about your own thinking.

Metacognitive Strategies

- VISUALIZING Involves the ability of readers to make images of a text as a way to understand processes during reading.
- MAKING CONNECTIONS Children make personal connections with the text using their schema (background knowledge).
- ASKING QUESTIONS Involves readers asking themselves questions throughout the reading of text.
- MAKING INFERENCES Authors provide clues readers can use to "read between the lines".
- DETERMINING IMPORTANCE Knowing why you're reading and making decisions about what information is most critical to understanding the overall meaning of the piece.
- SYNTHESIZING Process of ordering, recalling, retelling, and recreating into a coherent whole the information with which our minds are bombarded everyday.

Students solved a puzzle and displayed their dance moves to earn the key for the final Breakout Box.
























SCHOOL ADVISORY COUNCIL



Technology Tips

The student Chromebook has a special keyboard layout that is designed to help student productivity. Using the keyboard and touchpad are mostly intuitive. Here are some of the basic keyboard shortcuts to help with student academic productivity.

Take a screenshot: Press Ctrl + Show Windows □

Turn Caps Lock on or off: Press Search + Alt

See all keyboard shortcuts: Press Ctrl + Alt + / (forward slash)

Open a new window: Ctrl + n

Open a new tab: Ctrl + t

Maximize window: Alt + = (equals) Minimize window: Alt + - (minus) Print your current page: Ctrl + p

Zoom in on the page: Ctrl and + (plus) Zoom out on the page: Ctrl and - (minus)

Reset zoom level: Ctrl + 0

Search the current page: Ctrl + f Open the History page: Ctrl + h

Copy selected content to the clipboard: Ctrl + c Paste copied content from clipboard: Ctrl + v

Insert an emoji: Search + Shift + Space

Turn ChromeVox (spoken feedback) on or off: Ctrl + Alt + z

Turn on high contrast mode: Search + Ctrl + h
