

WOMEN'S HISTORIA




Algebra 2 students will be learning methods to solve and graph inequalities. They will be finding solutions to systems of inequalities and interpreting them in real-world contexts.

Students will also learn how to graph and interpret key features of square root and cube root functions in real-world scenarios. They will be able to determine the function type given graphs, tables or equations and make comparisons.

In Math for Data and Financial Literacy, students are wrapping up module 5 "Controlling the Costs". They have learned a lot of real-life applications. Some of the topics they have explored are cash vs financing, credit and debt payoff, student loans, credit scores and mortgage loans.



Precalculus students are exploring the analytical side of trigonometry. They are applying trigonometric identities and formulas to simplify expressions and problem solve. Students are also learning how to apply their knowledge of trigonometric formulas to prove trigonometric identities.



By the time they have completed module 6, students have been given the opportunity to solve numerous mathematical and real-world problems that could be modeled using trigonometric functions.


GIFTED NEWS




File Management Should Be Simple

- Have a Google Folder for each class
- Inside class folder, have two segment folders
- Inside segment folders, have module folders
- Name your files with Last name and module







When working with Google Docs, students may download a PDF formatted document to attach to an assignment to complete it. To do this, students should be in a completed Google Doc, click on "File" from the topmost menu, select "download," then select "PDF". This will make a PDF file for the student to then attach to an assignment. The file can be renamed prior to uploading to best accommodate a clean file system for the student. Suggested naming convention:
